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Play Equipment

What type(s) of play elements do you like? What type(s) do you feel would best fit your space? It could be helpful to think in terms of textures, sounds, colors, and materials as you select components for your space.

Look + Feel

How do you want visitors to feel when they visit your playground? It could be helpful to think about what defines and unifies your community. Is there a prominent industry (e.g. farming) or special attraction (e.g. armed forces base) that serves as the principal identity for your community?

Visitors

What age group(s) will your playground serve and how will the components you select address inclusivity? Inclusivity doesn't just happen. Planning for how your playground will address and promote equality among all visitors will ensure everyone feels welcome.

Modern

Classic post + deck systems that take whatever kids and weather can throw at them.

Rocks + Ropes

Precast concrete rocks and mindbending nets that take play to the next level.

Wooden

Sometimes the best solution is the warm, natural look and feel of wood.

Musical Instruments

Sound, rhythm and collaboration come together to help children and adults express themselves.

Surfacing Types

Poured-in-Place

A combination of rubber granules and a cushion layer of shredded rubber bonded with a polymer

Bonded Rubber Mulch

Shredded rubber mulch blended with polyurethane adhesive binders

Engineered Wood Fiber

Wood fibers that create a loose fill surface that "knits" together

Surfacing

What type of surfacing do you like? If you have other spaces with play components, what surfacing is used there? It can be helpful to think about elevations when deciding what surfacing is most appropriate. Remember that materials can have significantly different impact attenuation ratings.

Shade

Are you planning to construct your playground in an area with lots of mature trees that will provide a lot of shade? Are there any areas in your space where there is no natural shade at all? Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States, and good UV hygiene habits begin as children.



Components

What type(s) of gathering area(s) are in your space? How can you best promote appropriate usage in those area(s)? Shelters, tables and benches all signal pauses that are just as important in recreation as play or exercise and foster interaction and community connections.

Look + Feel

What style of site amenities do you like? How will those amenities contribute to the overall feel of the space?
